Seminole in the Hoop

The Seminole Indians developed Seminole patchwork in the early 1900's. It is basically done by sewing strips of fabric together, then cutting them into segments, and sewing the segments back together in new positions. From this simple concept, the variety of the designs you can achieve is endless. Strikingly decorative garments were a hallmark of the industrious Seminole quilters. Today, we are constantly finding ways to use technology to re-create the old needle arts. Using fill stitches and fabric, it is possible to recreate Seminole patterns in the hoop. Embroidery stamps and patterns create interesting texture

and detail in the traditional Seminole designs. The Seminole sampler features different ways to use fill stitches and fabric to create a striking wall hanging or the smaller pencil case project.
