

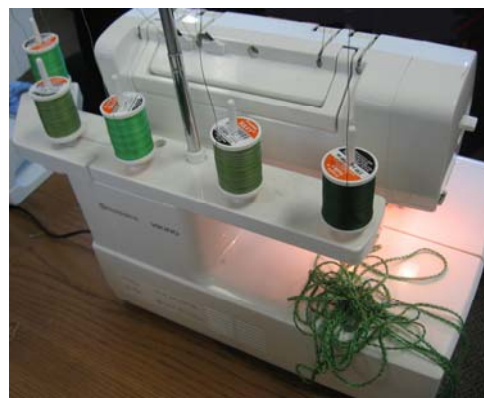
An Awesome Dotty Apron

Make “thread yarn” with your serger! It’s quick and easy, and you get to custom blend the colors. Make the funky multicolor trims, then stitch our pretty yarn flowers all over to create a one of a kind, custom made fabric! You pick the fabrics, you pick the colors,

Sewing Supplies:

- Husqvarna Viking Designer Sewing Machine
- Husqvarna Viking Huskylock Serger
- 1/2 yard of Large Multicolor Dot Print Cotton
- 3/4 yard of Small Green multicolor Dot Print Cotton
- 1 1/3 yards of Solid Cream Cotton
- 1/8 Yard of Purple Dot Cotton
- 1/8 Yard of Yellow/Orange Dot Cotton
- 1/8 Yard Green/White Dot Cotton
- 1/8 Yard Turquoise Swirl Print Cotton
- Yarn Couching Feet Set #920 215-096
- Clear View S Foot #412975145
- Clear 1/4” Piecing Foot w/Guide
- Assorted Sulky 12 wt. and 30 wt. Cotton Threads or Blendable Threads
- Assorted 40 wt. Rayon Embroidery Thread
- Bobbin Thread
- Sewing Thread
- INSPIRA® Tear-A-Way Stabilizer
- Fray Blocking Liquid
- 150mm x 150mm Do All Quilter’s Hoop #920115096
- Fasturn Tube Turner #140000001
- 1/2” wide Steam-A-Seam
- Button Foot with Placement Tool #412934545
- One Button 3/4” – 1”
- Pictogram Pin



Make “Thread Yarn”:

Thread your Huskylock as follows:

- Set for three thread rolled hem following the Sewing Advisor®.
- Insert a size 90 Topstitch needle in the right needle position.
- Place a 30 wt. green thread on the first spool pin on the left. Place 12 wt. green cotton or 40 wt. green rayon on each of the other four spool pins.
- Thread the first 12 wt. or 30 wt. thread on the left through the right needle. Remove the left needle.
- On the next two, bring the two threads together and thread through the upper looper.
- For the last two, bring together and thread through the lower looper.

Begin to serge, holding the tail taut, as it is coming out of the machine. Check the resulting “thread yarn” for consistency, and adjust the tensions (probably higher) to achieve a nice solid tail of “thread yarn”. Continue stitching until you have a small ball of “thread yarn”. Repeat for the remainder of colors. We made pink, purple, orange and blue.

Make the Trims:

Purple Scallops:

1. Cut two 1 3/4” x 28” strips from purple dot, yellow/orange dot, green and white dot and turquoise.
2. Place the two purple strips right sides together.



3. Select H2:35 .
4. Snap on your Clear View S Foot.
5. Thread with sewing thread on top and in the bobbin.
6. Align the edge of the Clear View S Foot with the edge of the strip. Stitch the length of the strip.



Yellow Orange Triangles:

1. Place the two yellow/orange dot strips right sides together.




2. Select Eight Way Stitch Menu .
3. There are two different stitch types, choose the single stitch for all three trims.

4. Touch  .
5. Touch .



6. Touch and hold .
7. Enter 11 for a total of 12 stitches.
8. Touch  12 times.





9. Touch and hold .
10. Enter 11 for a total of 12 stitches.
11. Touch  .
12. Stitch the length of the strip.


Green/White Dot Squares:

1. Place the two green/white dot strips right sides together.




2. Touch .
3. Touch and hold  , to delete all the stitches.
4. Touch  .





5. Touch and hold .
6. Enter 4 for a total of 5 stitches.
7. Touch  .



8. Touch and hold .
9. Enter 9 for a total of 10 stitches.
10. Touch  .



11. Touch and hold .
12. Enter 9 for a total of 10 stitches.

13. Touch  Touch and hold  .


14. Enter 9 for a total of 10 stitches.

15. Touch  .

16. Stitch the length of the strip.

Turquoise Saw Tooth:

1. Place the two turquoise strips right sides together.

2. Touch  .

3. Touch and hold  , to delete all the stitches.

4. Touch  .

5. Touch and hold  .

6. Enter 11 for a total of 12 stitches.

7. Touch  .

8. Touch and hold  .

9. Enter 11 for a total of 12 stitches.

10. Stitch the length of the strip.

11. Trim close to the stitching on all the strips and clip into the corners.

12. Turn and press.

Piece:

Before cutting out the apron, we will piece the fabrics together cut:

- One 5" x 27" from large multicolor dot print
- One 9" x 27" from small green multicolor dot
- One 9" x 27" Solid
- One 12" x 27" from large multicolor dot print

1. Snap on your Clear 1/4" Piecing Foot w/Guide.
2. Place the purple trim along the long edge of the 5" x 27" large multicolor dot strip.
3. Stitch in place.

4. Place the yellow/orange triangle trim along one long edge of the green multicolor strip.

5. Stitch in place.

6. Place the turquoise saw tooth trim along one long edge of the solid cream strip

7. Stitch in place.

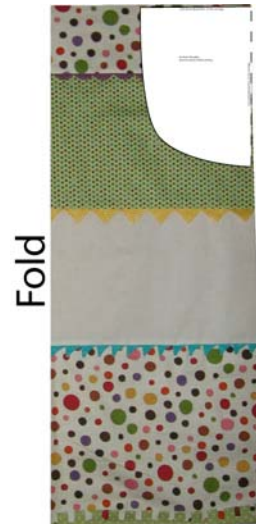
8. Place the green/white dot square trim along one long edge of the 12" x 27" large multicolor dot print

9. Stitch the strips together as shown. Stitch with the previous stitching up, and move your needle position one click to the left. Even though the Clear 1/4" Piecing Foot w/Guide is a straight stitch foot, there is room to move one or two clicks. By doing so, you will be sure your first row of stitching is covered.



Cut:

1. Cut lining 26" x 33 1/2" from cream cotton.
2. Fold pieced apron to measure 13" x 33 1/2". Place the armhole template as shown and cut the armhole through all layers of fabric.
3. Repeat for the lining.

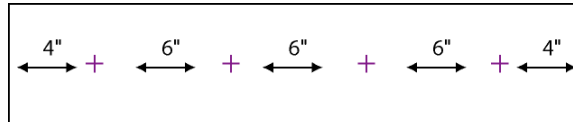



Embroider:

1. Thread with 40 wt. rayon embroidery thread on top and bobbin thread in the bobbin.
2. Hoop INSPIRA® Tear-A-Way Stabilizer in your 150mm x 150mm Do All Quilter's Hoop. Use the hoop marked Light, which is perfect since we are hooping the stabilizer only.
3. Using your Pictogram Pen, mark the center on the stabilizer as shown.



4. Mark your solid cream strip as shown.



5. Place your marked fabric onto the hooped stabilizer. Touch  to baste the fabric to the hoop.
6. Color 1 is the center of the leaves. Thread with green thread. Stitch the leaf centers.
7. Color 2 is the center of the flowers. Thread with the color for the first flower. Stitch the flower center.
8. Color 3 is the green leaf yarn. Using the threader that is provided, thread the yarn through one of your Yarn Couching Feet. Test the yarn and see if it is better in foot #1 or foot #2. It should pull freely, but fill the opening in the foot. With the yarn threaded through the foot from top to bottom, pull an inch or so to the back, and snap the foot onto the machine.

9. Slow the speed down to the second slowest speed. Touch **START** **STOP**. Using your stylus, keep the yarn tail from being sewn over. Complete the leaves.



10. When the color 3 is complete, cut between the leaves as shown, so you have a short yarn tail at each beginning and ending.
11. Color 4 is the flower. Thread with thread the color of your flower. Thread the flower colored yarn into the Yarn Couching Foot. Embroider the flower. Keep the yarn tail out of the way with your stylus.
12. The last color, color 5 is the flower center. Thread with thread to match your center yarn and thread the center yarn into the foot. Embroider the flower center keeping the yarn tails out of the way with your stylus.
13. Apply fray blocking liquid to the yarn where the stitching ends. Allow to dry. Cut off the thread ends after the fray blocking liquid is completely dry. If desired, you could pull the ends to the wrong side and tie off.

Make the Ties and Strap:

1. Cut two pieces for the neck strap from the 30" x 2 1/2" from the remaining small green multicolor fabric.
2. Cut four pieces 1 1/2" x width of fabric for the back ties.
3. Using the marks on your rotary cutter ruler, cut a 60° angle on one end as shown. photo
4. Fold over the strip, and using the first end as your guide, cut the same angle on the other end.
5. Thread with sewing thread top and bobbin.
6. Snap on your Clear 1/4" Piecing Foot w/Guide.
7. Place the two neck strap pieces right sides together. Stitch, leaving one short end open.



8. Repeat for the two back ties.
9. Clip the corners, turn using your Fasturn Tube Turner and press.
10. Pin the neck strap as shown, aligning the raw edges.
11. Pin the ties along the top of the edges aligning the raw edges.
12. Place the apron front and lining right sides together. Stitch leaving an 8" opening for turning.



13. Clip the corners, turn and press.
14. Insert 1/2" wide Steam-A-Seam in the opening and press with steam to fuse closed.
15. Try on your apron. Mark the placement for the buttonhole on the neck strap.
16. Snap on your One Step Sensor Buttonhole Foot. Make a buttonhole, the correct size for your button.
17. Snap on your Button Foot.
18. Stitch the button in place to correspond with the buttonhole.

You are ready to start cooking!!!
