

A Rose is but a Rose...

A rose is but a rose until it is sewn to a jacket on the Fabric Mover! Then, it is a “Work of Art”. All you need is a purchased jacket or one you made yourself, a silk scarf from Grandma, maybe? Choose some pretty thread, and you are ready to SEW!

Sewing Supplies:

Husqvarna Viking Fabric Mover with Stitch Regulator
 Husqvarna Viking Computerized Sewing Machine
 40 wt. Rayon Thread
 Bobbin Thread
 Purchased or Sewn Jacket
 Printed Silk Scarf with Flowers or Other Motif



Let's Move that Fabric:

1. Thread your machine with 40 wt. Rayon thread on top and Bobbin Thread in the bobbin. Set it for Free Motion sewing following the instructions in your Users Guide.
2. Lay your scarf on your jacket, and decide where you want the flowers to go. Cut apart, but don't cut out the motif, and pin on the different pieces. Try on your jacket to be sure your placement is flattering; no roses in the armpits or in areas you don't want to highlight.
3. Place your Fabric Mover with Stitch Regulator on your machine and connect according to Fabric Mover with Stitch Regulator instructions. Place your jacket on the Fabric Mover textured surface. Select the area to begin. We began with the roses and chose a pinkish grey thread that was close to the outline color in the scarf. You are highlighting the print in the scarf only. The intention is not to fill it in completely. So, stitch around the rose and highlight certain of the darker areas near the bottom of the flower petals.
4. Continue onto the other areas of the scarf. We used a green for the leaves and stems.
5. When your stitching is complete, trim approximately 1/8" to 1/4" outside the stitching. The raw edges add to the “art” effect and are very trendy!
