

## Baby to Go!

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In a rush? Just have a couple of errands to do? Don't need the whole diaper bag, but you just can't chance not having a diaper handy! "Baby to Go" to the rescue. This little holder has just enough room for a couple of diapers and wipes. Toss it in your purse, leave it in the car, or wherever it will be ready when you need it. This is a must to have on hand for baby showers! Stitch the baby with pink diapers for a girl and blue for a boy. Personalize it with the baby's name using the letters built in to your machine or your 4D Embroidery Software.



### Sewing Supplies:

Husqvarna Viking Sewing/Embroidery Machine  
 1/3 yard cotton for outer packet  
 1/2 cotton contrast for inner lining and pockets  
 Warm and Natural Cotton Batting  
 Mettler or Robison Anton 50 wt. Cotton Thread for Embroidery  
 Bobbin Thread  
 Inspira Tear-A-Way Light stabilizer  
 Rotary Cutter, Mat and Ruler  
 2 yards Cotton Cord to make piping  
 Husqvarna Viking Piping Foot #411 85 19-45  
 Piping Hot Binding Tool #140 000 971  
 3" strip of Hook and Loop Tape

### Cut:

From Outer fabric:

One rectangle 12" x 18" for outer piece

From Lining fabric:

One rectangle 12" x 18" for lining

One rectangle 14" x 18" for pocket

1 1/2" wide bias strip for piping 64" long (piece as needed)

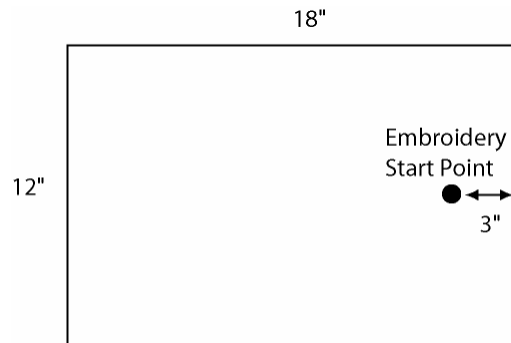
From Batting

One rectangle 12" x 18"



## Embroider:

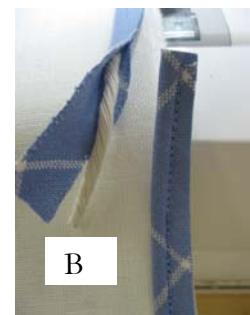
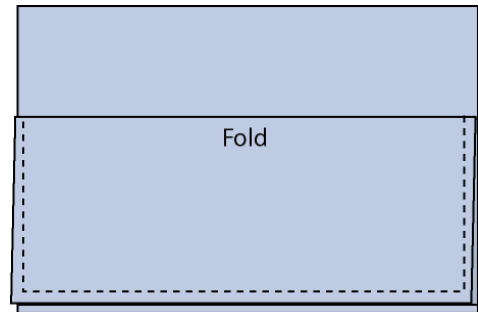
1. Mark the embroidery start point on the outer fabric as shown.
2. Download the free design for June 2007 from [www.husqvarnaviking.com](http://www.husqvarnaviking.com). This baby design will be free during June and July and will be available for purchase thereafter from [www.myembroideries.com](http://www.myembroideries.com).



3. If desired, add the babies name under the baby design using your built in letters, or your 4D Embroidery Software. Thread with 50 wt. cotton Mettler or Robison Anton thread on top and bobbin thread in the bobbin. Embroider the baby design on the outer fabric.

## Sew:

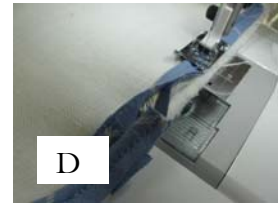
1. Fold the pocket piece in half, wrong sides together to form a piece 7" x 18". Press. Place this pocket piece on the lining matching the raw edges as shown.
2. Stitch around the three sides of the pocket near the edge, to secure the raw edges.
3. Wrap the 1 1/2" bias strip around the cord. Snap on your piping foot. Stitch, aligning the cord in the groove of the foot to make your piping. Using your Piping Hot Binding Tool trim the piping to 1/4".
4. Place the white embroidered outer piece on the batting. Stitch piping around the outer piece through both layers. Start 2" or so from the end of the piping. Snip the corners to allow the strip to lay flat. Stop sewing 1" from where you started.
5. Snap on your Clear Piping foot. Thread with sewing thread on top and in the bobbin. Place the piping on the printed fabric picture, aligning the raw edges. Begin stitching about 1" from the end of the piping. You can start at any point on the picture. Select straight stitch. On the bag front, stitch the piping around the edge of the printed image and stop about 3" from where the piping ends need to join. Trim the piping end so the ends overlap by approximately 1". (A)
6. Rip back the stitching to the point where the first end stops exposing the cord inside. (B)



7. Trim the cord so that the ends of the cord will just meet. Trim any excess fabric that was around the cord so you have between 1/2" and 3/4" of fabric.(C)



8. Fold under the fabric and wrap the folded end around the other end of the piping. Continue stitching over the joint.(D)



9. Fold the bag in thirds with the embroidery on top. Mark the placement for the Hook and Loop tape as shown. Snap on your A Foot and stitch in place.

10. Place the lining with the pockets wrong sides together with the embroidered outer piece and mark the placement for the Hook and Loop tape on the lining. Stitch 1/4" in from the raw edge on the lining only.



11. Place the outer and lining pieces right sides together. Snap on your Piping Foot. Stitch around the entire piece leaving a 4" opening to turn. Trim the corners.

12. Turn right side out, press.

13. Fold in thirds and mark the fold lines. Stitch through all the layers. This will help the holder to fold properly and also stitches the divisions in the pockets. Fill with a small container of wipes in the center and a diaper or two on each side.
