

Huskylock Ladder Stitch Trim

Serge fabric or ribbon trim to the finished edge of a skirt, cuffs or lapel with this hand-look blanket stitch for a designer finish.

Huskylock Setting: Follow the instructions on your Sewing Advisor to set up for 2-Thread Flatlock.

You will need 1 1/2" wide strip of bias cut fabric pressed in half lengthwise or ribbon.

Thread: Left Needle: Sulky 12 wt. thread
Lower Loper: Regular cone thread

Needle: Topstitching Needle size 90-100

Tension: Left Needle: 0
Lower Loper: 5-6

Two Thread Converter: on Upper Loper

Stitch Length: 5.0 (Longest)
Stitch Width: 6.0

Presser Foot: Multi-Purpose The guide should be set just to the left of the cutting knife as shown.

1. Fold fabric in half and place a 1 1/2" strip of fabric or ribbon on the finished edge of the garment. If you are using fabric, place the fold of the fabric even with the finished edge of the fabric. This is a raw edge technique. The finished edge will be raw and will fray when washed.
2. For a more finished look, use ribbon. Place the finished edge and the folded edge of the fabric or ribbon against the guide on the M Foot.
3. Slowly serge along the edge.

Note: Multi-Purpose foot will protect edge of fabric from being cut as you serge.

Remove fabric and pull the needle thread loose in the thread tail. Tie the needle thread and the lower looper thread together in several knots and trim the ends. Carefully pull bias fabric or ribbon toward edge of fabric to reveal Ladder stitch.
